2007-08 THUNDER WOMEN'S BASKETBALL SEASON PREVIEW

The Wheaton College women's basketball team will have a different look in the 2007-08 season. Absent from this year's roster are three starters from the past three seasons and a key reserve. Seniors Elizabeth Fox, Brittany Cooper and Emily Carwell have graduated after four years in the Thunder program, while Jill Trenz, a three-year starter at center, left Wheaton a year early to attend nursing school. During the seniors' four seasons at Wheaton, the Thunder won three CCIW Championships, with three NCAA Tournament appearances and the squad compiled a record of 88-24, the best four-year mark in the program's history. Head coach Beth Baker notes of the upcoming season, "This will be a re-building year. I don't think we have had a re-building year in quite some time. Any time you lose three 1,000-point scorers [Fox, Trenz and Cooper], you have to re-build." She continues, "As a coaching staff this is exciting. This is a completely new experience for this program. This is the first time we have entered a season and not been quite sure what to expect."

Despite the changes in personnel, Baker's track record speaks for itself. In 21 seasons at the helm of the Wheaton program she has compiled a career record of 393-153 for a 72% winning percentage. She is among the top-25 winningest active coaches in Division III women's basketball. Baker notes, "We have been a very successful program and have had a culture of winning. It will be interesting to see how that factors in this year. Our goals have not changed. We want to win the conference championship and win the conference tournament. Even if these goals are unrealistic, they still remain our goals."

Baker mentions, "We have some players that will have the opportunity to step up and show what they can do this year. Some of them were behind the players that have left, so now they have the opportunity to show what they can do." She notes of her team's preparation for the season, "During the early part of the season, this has been one of the hardest working teams I have been around. This group is very coachable." Baker adds, "Defense has always been a strength of our program and this year it is going to have to be superior."

The top returning scorer is junior guard Kathleen Fidelia. Fidelia was a Third Team All-CCIW selection last year. She averaged 11.3 points per game last year, with 4.3 rebounds and three assists a game and led the squad in steals with 2.2 per game. Baker notes of Fidelia, "Kathleen is a solid player. She has worked on her game and improved over the summer." The Thunder mentor concludes, "She is a real hard worker and very coachable. She is our captain, our leader, and will be our go-to player this year. We are expecting Kathleen to have a fantastic year."

Several guards will be in the mix to join Fidelia in the backcourt and they could all possibly see substantial playing time. Senior Katie Heddell, junior Lynnea Kvam, sophomore Sarah Jones and freshman Lissie McAlvey (Lansing, Mich./Lansing Christian) could all contribute at guard. Heddell was a regular for the Thunder last year, including 16 games as a starter. She averaged 4.1 points per game last year, second among the returning players on this year's squad. Baker notes of her, "Katie could be a possible starter at point guard for us this year. She is a steady player, but we need her to make more of an impact for us this season."

Kvam was the top three-point shooter on the team last year with a 37% effort from behind the arc. Baker says of the junior, "Lynnea is an outstanding three-point shooter. We will need consistent outside shooting from her this year." Jones played in every game as a freshman for the Thunder last year. The Thunder head coach says of her, "Sarah Jones is a spark plug. She is a real energetic player and she gives us a lot of energy when she

is on the court." Baker notes of McAlvey, the newcomer, "Lissie McAlvey should see valuable time this year. We believe that she will be able to make an immediate contribution this year for us." Guards Beth Masopust and Noelle Dryden have also been valuable contributors as Baker notes, "Both Beth and Noelle are two of our hardest-working players."

In the frontcourt is where Thunder fans will see reserve players from last year take on increased roles, while some newcomers could also have an immediate impact. In the center position, two returnees could split time, junior Whitney Edgecombe and sophomore Carissa Bacon. Baker says of Edgecombe, "Whitney has had good practice experience behind Trenz the previous two years. She has an opportunity to earn a job as a starter this year; we need her to step up into a bigger role. She is very competitive, very coachable and is an excellent help defender." The Thunder mentor notes of Bacon, "She will probably split time with Whitney. Carissa is going to get an opportunity to play and we are hopeful for big things from her." Six-foot freshman Kelly Brooks (Asheville, N.C./Asheville Christian Academy) is a newcomer who could contribute this year. Baker says of the rookie, "Kelly has a knack for scoring." Michelle Richard is a senior leader who has been a valuable contributor to the program.

A couple of newcomers and a senior are among the mix at the forward position for the Thunder this year. Junior Jamie Jones (Abilene, Texas/Hamilton) is a five-foot-11-inch transfer into Wheaton from Hardin-Simmons University. Baker says of her, "Jamie Jones has the potential to be a good scorer. She is athletic and has the potential to start and be a significant player. Right now we are working on her play at the defensive end of the court." Freshman Annie Bowen (Wheaton, Ill./Wheaton North) is also new to the program this year. Baker mentions of the five-foot-nine-inch forward, "Annie is a tough kid, a good competitor and a solid rebounder. She has impressed the coaching staff as a gritty competitor, along the lines of Brittany Cooper." Senior captain Claire Glass also returns and is expected to see an increased role this year. Last season she played in 25 games, averaging nearly two points per game. Baker notes of the senior, "Claire has an opportunity to contribute and see significant playing time this year." The Thunder head coach adds, "She has done a nice job as a captain during the preseason."

Wheaton's untested players will get tested early and often this season, with a schedule that will be immensely challenging. Five teams on Wheaton's schedule are ranked in the D3Hoops.com preseason Top-25 poll and two more teams are un-ranked, but receiving votes. Four of the teams are on Wheaton's non-conference schedule and three are in the CCIW. Following its season-opening Lee Pfund Classic, the Thunder will host national powers UW-Oshkosh and UW-Stevens Point on Nov. 23-24. The Pointers are ranked 24th in the D3Hoops.com preseason poll. On November 30 and December 1 Wheaton will compete in the CCIW-MIAA Classic, hosted by Hope College. The Thunder will open against Calvin, ranked ninth in the preseason poll and conclude the tournament against Hope, ranked fourth. On December 8 Wheaton will host a University of Chicago club that is expected to challenge in the highly-competitive University Athletic Association. The conference schedule also features ranked foes. Millikin is ranked 13th in the D3Hoops.com poll. Illinois Wesleyan, second in the CCIW last year behind Wheaton, is ranked 15th in the poll. Carthage is also receiving votes in the poll.

WHEATON WOMEN'S BASKETBALL HEAD COACH BETH BAKER



The 2007-08 season marks Beth Baker's 22nd season as head women's basketball coach at Wheaton College. Her teams have won 72 percent of their games (393-153).

Under Baker's direction, Wheaton has won six conference championships, made the NCAA Division III Tournament seven times, and has placed in the top four in every year of CCIW competition. Baker's first season at Wheaton was also the first season the CCIW sponsored women's basketball as a championship sport. Also during her tenure the program has produced four All-Americans, four CCIW Players of the Year, and 55 All Conference player selections.

Last year, Wheaton won its third consecutive CCIW Championship and earned a berth to the NCAA Division III Tournament. Wheaton advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament as the Thunder finished 20-8.

In 2005-06 Baker was named the CCIW Coach of the Year as her squad posted its 11th consecutive season with 19 or more victories. The 2005-06 team set a school record for victories in a season with 25 and advanced to the "Sweet 16" of the NCAA Tournament for the first time in the program's history.

The 2004-05 team finished at 22-4 overall and 13-1 in conference play tying for first place with Millikin. In 2003-04 Baker lead the Thunder to an overall record of 21-7 and they won the CCIW Tournament to receive the automatic bid for the NCAA Division III Tournament. Coach Baker received "Coach of the Year" honors by both the CCIW and Illinois Basketball Coaches Association.

The 1991-92 team was Baker's first to win a conference championship and 20 games. Wheaton went 22-4 overall and 14-2 in the CCIW. "Player of the Year" and former assistant Jeanine Jankovsky was a key contributor on that team.

Wheaton also went 22-5 in 1995-96, and earned its first-ever NCAA Division III playoff appearance. Wheaton defeated Carthage in the first round and lost by five to Washington University (Mo.) in the second round. Baker was named WBCA District Coach of the Year.

Paced by All-Americans Stephanie Clark and Nicole Merchant, the second- and third-leading scorers in Wheaton history, Wheaton won a repeat trip to the NCAA championships in 1996-97, and recorded its second consecutive 20-win season for the first time in its history. Wheaton rebounded from losing Clark and Merchant with a 19-7 (11-3; 2nd place CCIW) season in 1997-98, and returned for a third consecutive season to the NCAA playoffs.

Baker was also named CCIW Coach of the Year in 1998-99 after guiding Wheaton to a 19-8 (12-2 CCIW) record. Lead by

All-American and CCIW "Player of the Year" Kerry Cole, Wheaton made their fourth straight appearance into the NCAA Division III tournament. In addition, Baker was selected as the Illinois Division III Women's Basketball Coach of the Year by the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association.

The Thunder tied Millikin for the CCIW 2001-02 CCIW Championship going 12-2 and 21-4 overall. Baker was again selected as the CCIW "Coach of the Year."

Baker has led Wheaton to a total CCIW record of 216-76, a winning percentage of .740. Her 393 career wins are the highest total for any coach in Wheaton's 47-year women's basketball history. She picked up her 100th career win against Elmhurst on Dec. 1, 1992, and her 200th at Aurora on Jan. 31, 1998. Her 300th win came in a 62-55 victory at Illinois Wesleyan on Feb. 1, 2003.

Baker graduated from Wheaton College in 1977 with a bachelor's degree in health and physical education. Baker also played basketball for Wheaton from 1973-77. She went on to earn a master's degree in education from Georgia State University in 1984.

Prior to coming to Wheaton, Baker coached basketball at Avondale and Redan High Schools in Georgia, leading Avondale to two regional championships and a two-year record of 44-7. Baker was named Greater Atlanta Area Coach of the Year twice.

During the summer of 1979, Baker was a member of the Venture Victory women's basketball team that toured South America. An international outreach of Overseas Crusades, the team played local squads and held instructional clinics, while also presenting the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Coach Baker resides in Wheaton and has three grown children; Kyle, Jori and Drew.

KENT MADSEN - ASSISTANT COACH



This year Kent Madsen begins his 10th season of coaching at the college level. This is Madsen's seventh season at Wheaton as a full-time assistant basketball coach.

Since Madsen joined the basketball staff, Wheaton has won five CCIW Championships and has made four NCAA Division

III tournament appearances. The Thunder has also finished second nationally in 2002, fifth in 2005, and ninth in 2006 in scoring defense.

Madsen graduated from Westmont College in Santa Barbara, California in 1988, with a bachelor's degree in physical education. He earned a master's degree in recreation administration from Aurora University in 2004.

Madsen coached the varsity boys' basketball team at Valley Christian High School in San Jose, California, from 1994-96. His teams were 37-17 in those two seasons, and both teams played in the Central Coast sectional championships. The 1994-95 team won the sectional title, made the final eight in the northern California playoffs and was ranked 10th in the state at the end of the season. Madsen's 1995-96 team placed 2nd in the sectional. Both teams ranked high in the CIF northern section among Division 4 teams.

Kent and his wife, Laurie, were married in 1994, and moved to Illinois from the San Jose area in 1996. Kent taught junior high and high school physical education and health, and coached basketball while at Aurora Christian Schools from 1996-2001. The Madsen's have two children; Kirsten and Trey.

Sara Arnold, a former four-year letterwinner for the Thunder, is in her second season as an assistant coach. In May of 2005 she earned her degree in elementary education from Wheaton. In addition to her role with the Thunder women's basketball program Arnold

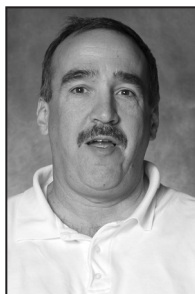
is in her third year of teaching at Emerson Elementary School, in Wheaton, Illinois.

HISTORY OF WHEATON COLLEGE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL - BY STEVE KAFKAS

THE FIRST YEARS

Basketball teams first formed among Wheaton's various literary societies at the turn of the century. These literary societies were for many years the basis of social life at Wheaton College. They gave members an opportunity to interact, discuss, debate and compete.

A few women from each of these clubs formed a basketball team in 1899 and played against each other as part of the dedication of the new gymnasium, which is now the campus art building. This game, played just before the men's game, was the first recorded basketball game at Wheaton. The Aeliolian ladies defeated the Philathians 8-7.

According to Ed Coray's *Through Clouds and Sunshine*, the women began playing intercollegiate basketball in 1900, a year before the men.

On March 9, 1901, the school paper, the *Record*, reported that the Wheaton women avenged an earlier loss to DeKalb by the score of 8-4. Despite the low score, there was a clear sense of pride that the players took in their victory. The paper proudly heralded the win, writing, "The Wheaton students were jubilant over the victory."

The women continued to play intercollegiate games until 1906. Some of the games were quite lively and competitive. Another game against DeKalb was witnessed by 400 fans, but Wheaton lost 13-4.

Wheaton beat Lake Forest 20-7 in the 1904-05 season. The baskets in Lake Forest's gym had apparently been put a foot too high and not opposite each other, and instead of hardwood backboards there was a wire screen. There was also discussion before the game began because the Lake Forest women had been used to playing a non-interference game, in which no touching of the ball was allowed when someone else had it. Lake Forest said that they had never before played such a rough game. It appears that they adjusted to the rules quickly, though, as the Wheaton players reported that their arms and faces were continually pounded by their opponents.

In 1905-06 season, the women defeated Sycamore High School 50-5. The "varsity" team was wearing brand new uniforms and played "the best game any women's team had ever played on our floor," according to the *Record*. The 50 points would stand as a record for many years, because intercollegiate play was suspended after the season.

The last game of the season, against McKinley High School from Chicago, was canceled at the last minute. As a replacement the "dorm" girls played against the "outsiders," the latter team winning 16-13.

It was a faculty ban that stopped intercollegiate play for more than 50 years. After an unofficial scrimmage against Wheaton High School in 1911, the *Record* commented, "We hope the faculty will see fit in the near future to let the girls play open games." Despite the support of the *Record* the college only allowed intramural competition for women interested in playing basketball or other sports.

INTRAMURAL COMPETITION 1906-1960

In the years between varsity competition, many athletic women continued to attend Wheaton, but they had trouble finding outlets for their abilities. There was a well-organized intramural program, but by nature there were no practices, no training and no competition against other schools. Women who enjoyed athletic competition knew they were giving that up when they came to

Wheaton, but they chose to come anyway. They found other things to fill that place.

Between the 1940's and the late 50's, the opportunities for women to compete against players from other schools expanded. Playdays were organized in which institutions would send interested players to another school and they would divide up and play. The matches were competitive, but no school emerged the victor. Since they often played against women from their own school, the bus rides back home would often be quite intense.

Many of the women at this time, especially those who established women's basketball rules and organizations, were against varsity competition. It was okay if, by splitting up teams, competition was spread around, but they did not want a particular school to come out on top.

Gradually, the feelings about competition and the rules changed. In the late 50's, each school would bring its own team and they would play other schools. It was not really a tournament, though, because it was round-robin style, meaning that no one advanced and no one was eliminated. The essence of it was still a "playday."

In just a short time, though, playdays would move aside for extra-murals, the long awaited resumption of intercollegiate play. Jean Anderson, who graduated in 1962, was very important in the movement to more competitive playdays and then to extra-murals. Anderson was a star in every sport she tried. When the *Record* mentioned women's athletics, which was not that often, it could not help mentioning Anderson's accomplishments. Wheaton's first head coach Martha Baptista credits Anderson with providing a lot of the impetus and student organization in those early years.

INTERCOLLEGIATE PLAY RESUMES

In 1960, the Women's Recreation Association, which organized athletic events for women at the college, started a basketball team that began playing other colleges. In the 1960-61 season, Wheaton played 10 games and finished with a record of 6-4. Despite the building of the new Centennial Gymnasium, the women played and practiced in Alumni Gym. They raised money by checking coats at men's basketball games.

During the 1960's Wheaton played more games than any other school in the northern Illinois region. Under the direction of Coach Baptista, who had coached the team during the last years of playdays, the program became one of the best women's programs in the country. In her nine years of varsity coaching, Baptista's teams amassed a record of 77 wins and only 17 losses.

Most of the women on those teams were satisfied with where women's basketball had progressed. They were thankful to be able to play and they had no real aspirations to make women's basketball more like men's basketball. They desired to have the resources to play good basketball, but they were not necessarily interested in gaining varsity status.

There was also considerable pressure in the athletic department not to have women's basketball reach complete varsity status. Coach Baptista was surprised by the opposition, but it was not a phenomenon that was isolated to Wheaton College. All across the country, colleges and universities were struggling with the role of women's athletics.

It was the work of Baptista and Marilyn Scribner that slowly began to transform the perception of women's athletics at Wheaton College. They began the work of developing programs on their own, Baptista with basketball and Scribner with volleyball and softball.

HISTORY OF WHEATON COLLEGE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL - CONTINUED

Baptista remembers that when her husband, Bob Baptista, retired as the men's soccer coach and became a Dean at the college that he saw some of the inequalities that were present and things began to change from an administrative standpoint.

She stresses, though, that when the idea reached the school administration it was all for women's varsity athletics. The real discussion came in the athletic department and took a few years to resolve. It was still many years, though, before real equality in resources was addressed.

While Baptista and Scribner admit that they never could have imagined at the time that women's athletics would reach the level it has, Baptista recalls that some of her players understood well where the world of women's athletics was headed. A lot of those players have, since graduating, become coaches of women's programs around the country.

Despite a lack of practice time and gym space the women's basketball teams during the 1960's were very successful. Between 1964-68, they compiled a record of 41-3. They were one of the best teams in the country those four seasons, and in the 1967-68 season finished with an undefeated record in 11 games.

During those early years of women's basketball, the University of Iowa was considered the top program in the country. In 1967-68, though, Wheaton beat Iowa 42-40, also defeating two other very good teams in Michigan — Hope and Calvin. At this time in women's basketball there were no playoffs to determine a national champion. With all this said, the general consensus of the time was that Wheaton was as close as one could get to being a national champion.

FROM THE AIAW TO THE NCAA

Until the early 1970's, the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women governed women's athletics across the country. Illinois took the lead in the AIAW in many ways. The organization grew and as the success increased the need for money increased as well.

The NCAA grew tired of the noise caused by the AIAW and took it over. This act, which might seem to be the savior of women's athletics, stopped a lot of the progress that was started by the AIAW. In terms of equity of resources, it would not be until lawsuits from Title IX started hitting universities that change began to occur.

THE 70's AND EARLY 80's.

At Wheaton, the basketball team's success waned slightly in the mid to late 70's as the world of women's basketball started to grow. As other institutions began to invest in their programs, Wheaton found it harder to compete against the large universities. The program still enjoyed success, though, and has only had three losing seasons in its history.

Scribner began coaching the team in 1970 by default, because she was certified to officiate games. She had never worked on anything as hard as she worked on coaching basketball. She went to numerous basketball camps and had to learn how to coach the game.

When the NCAA took over, it changed the rules that had been in place since the beginning of extra-mural competition. Until then, games were played with six players for each team. There were three guards and three forwards. Guards remained on the defensive side and the forwards remained on the offensive

side. So the game was essentially three on three. In the mid-60's a roving guard was added who could go on both sides of the floor. This innovation dramatically changed the way the game was played. Under NCAA rules, the standard five players were used and there was no longer any restriction about where they could go.

Scribner recalls that she knew how to run an offense with two-on-two and three-on-three, but did not know what to do with the other two players. Without the elaborate training manuals and videos that are available today, it was difficult for a coach to learn new strategies. Through hard work Scribner managed to keep Wheaton successful and her teams won over 60% of their games in her five seasons as head coach.

In 1973, a player came to Wheaton College who would eventually bring the program to a level of consistent success. Beth McKinney (Baker) played at Wheaton College from 1973-77.

STRONG VISION BUILDS STRONG PROGRAMS

Since beginning her tenure in 1986, Baker has been successfully built a top-quality program. Her teams have won 393 games in her 21 seasons. The women's basketball team has won six conference championships and since 1996 have made seven appearances in the NCAA Tournament, including three during four years from (2003-07). Baker and her assistant, Kent Madsen, have continued to build this strong program around good recruiting and a commitment to winning.

"I like to refer to the ladies who were here at the beginning as the Matriarchs, because they were here when everything started and they made the sacrifices," said former assistant coach and CCIW Player of the Year Jeanine Jankovsky. "Without them we wouldn't be where we are today."

The ability of a program to consistently compete for a conference championship and to go to the national tournament is not something that happens by chance. The groundwork for success is laid long before the success is seen in wins and losses.

The program is also successful in its ability to develop women of character. This is a result of the consistent Christian leadership that this program has had over the years. The coaches have cared not only about winning, but also about the spiritual growth of their players. Ultimately, they coached to bring glory to God and have tried to instill that desire in their players.

A good program sustains itself over the years, because its players return to coach, support and send their daughters. Wheaton women's basketball has succeeded in laying the solid foundation of basketball played to God's glory, now we are just beginning to see the fruits of the labors. It is seen in wins and losses, but also in changed lives.
